1. On Tuesday morning (14 July 1953), the writer, accompanied by _____ of the Technical Branch and _____ of _____, visited the offices of _____ and examined and tested in a general way the Sidetone Delay device that _____ had brought from _____ to Washington.

2. These tests, referred to above, were of a perfunctory nature and concerned the working of the device rather than testing of the device for the needs of _____ or the Technical Branch.

This conference concluded at approximately 11:15 AM with the agreement that after _____ had made a brief study of the Sidetone Delay device and had taken whatever photographs or papers they considered necessary, the _____ people responsible would get in touch with the writer and arrange for the delivery of the Sidetone Delay device and related papers to the Technical Branch. No time was allotted for this but the writer was informed that it would not take long, the implication being that _____ interest would be only a matter of a few days.

4. It should be noted for the record that _____ were both out of the city for this demonstration. The writer left word for _____ to call him upon her return to her desk in connection with the Sidetone delay device matter.

5. Thereafter, arrangements were made with _____ to discuss certain secret matters with the writer at 3:00 PM the same day and to discuss certain matters pertaining to the polygraph with _____ and some of his group on the following day, Wednesday, 15 July 1953, in _____ office.
