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Interrogation Research Section


Suggested Over-All Research Program.

The necessity for keeping well informed of present interregation methods and special operational methods used by unfriendly countries cannot be over emphasized. Below are listed various suggested phases of research and proposed details for the corrying out of a progressive and extremely active research program.

It is recommended that every effort be made to acquire and review existing literature covoring past and present interrogation techniques and the use of such operational procedures as hypnotic and drug control. The review would include all erticles in poriodicals and books written by specialists on such subjects as general interrogation, psychological interrogation, the use of the Polygraph, truth sorum and hypnosis. Those specialists may not be actively engaged in interrogation but may be working in allied fields which might provide valuable contributions to our own interests. This survey would also include the careful scrutinization of all intolligence reports involving interrogation methods and special operational techniques. The flow of information from this source would be greatly accelerated by the issuance of an interrogation collection roquiroment. The "existing technique" survey should also include facilities for the investigation of the use or suspected use of special techniques. Medical and psychiatric practitioners would be valuable contributors and liaison with such individuals would be extremely beneficial. The research sections of police departments and criminology laboratories might all prove to be very beneficial. Suggested methods for limison with such organizations will be covered in a separate momorandum. Good liaison with other governmental agencies and the various branches of the military service would be very helpful. Liaison with professional hypnotists could contribute many pointers which might be applied to certain phases of our problems. Lialson with certain universities which are outstanding in fields allied to our interests would be boneficial. In some cases, liaison with the above mentioned organizations and individuals would involve a cover to conceal CIA interest in such matters.

The survey of "existing techniques" previously mentioned would take care of methods used in the past and present and made a matter of record through books, perfodicals and reports. It is fell that active research should be conducted in conjunction with "technique verification". This verification would involve research on reportedly existing techniques and actual experimentation carried out to preve and disprove their value and effectiveness. This research would involve the volunteering of subjects for actual laboratory experiments. Reports envering those experiments would be furnished in the form of lectures, demonstrations and systematic written coverage.





Bosidos the survey of "existing techniques", and the "technique verification", a third phase should be kept active covering "new methods". This program would also involve actual laboratory recognized the issuing of verbal and written reports. This phase would also include the improvement of techniques already in existence.

As-of this date, it is folt that this Interrogation Research Section is more progressive and far in advance of all existing governmental, police, and private research activities concerning the use of operational hypnesis and highly specialized methods of interrogation. It is felt that this local might be maintained and that the program might be further accelerated by the execution of the above mentioned suggestions.
